Grant Helps Bring Wi-Fi to Southport Parks

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a federal program that was established to help bridge the digital divide within rural communities and ensure that everyone can participate in the digital age. Those who qualify for the program are eligible for free or discounted internet service from FOCUS Broadband. Eligibility can depend on factors such as participation in programs like Medicare, SNAP, SSI, WIC, Lifeline or the free and reduced-price lunch program in public schools. Navigating the Wave of Change:

The Impact of Rising Cable TV Costs and Retransmission Consent on FOCUS Broadband

Over the past decade, the cost of cable TV programming has surged, driven by demands from media giants who own most of the cable networks. This is an industry-wide problem that not only impacts FOCUS Broadband but also every company that provides cable TV channels.

The dramatic surge in cable TV bills is also caused by Retransmission Consent, a process that requires cable providers to pay local broadcasters to air channels that are otherwise free over the air. The exclusive rights of local stations in Wilmington for the Brunswick, Columbus, and Pender County markets provide them with significant leverage, resulting in fees soaring by over 500% in the past decade.

Cable TV costs go up each January because of increasing programming expenses, the requirement to carry low-rated channels, and the flawed Retransmission Consent process. In January, FOCUS Broadband will adjust our rates to cover these increased content expenses.

We understand the concerns about rising cable TV costs. We don't like it either. To address this, we suggest combining FOCUS Broadband's high-speed internet with streaming services like YouTube TV, Sling TV, Hulu, and other apps or an over-the-air antenna. This approach may offer you greater flexibility, more choices, and the potential for cost savings.
